Tips for Locating Websites

Remember the guidelines for minimizing wasted time on the internet! (See the internet hotlist handout)

- 1. To locate student - appropriate websites, use search engines designed for student use**
 1. Yahoooligans: www.yahoooligans.com
 2. Google: www.google.com
 3. The Library Spot: www.libraryspot.com
- 2. Use search engines designed for teacher use (lesson plans, previewed sites for lessons)**

 3. Edview: <http://edview.apple.com>
 4. Classroom Connect's GRADES database www.classroom.net (subscription)
- 3. Use "meta-search" tools (search more than one website at once)**
 1. For Windows: "Copernic 2000" - www.copernic.com
 2. For Mac: "Sherlock" built into Macintosh OS 8.5 and above. (Press Command-F to access it.)
- 4. Subscribe to an educational listserv / mailing list for site ideas**

 3. Britannica Online: <http://search.eb.com> (ask librarian for password)
 4. Maps 101: www.maps101.com (ask librarian for password)
2. Use search engines designed for students (see sites above)
3. Use search engines with family / content filters turned ON (www.altavista.com)
